

KEY GRAMMAR FACTS

 All nouns in French have a gender - they are either masculine or feminine. We can tell which gender a noun is by the article that goes before it:

ARTICLE	MASCULINE	FEMININE
а	Un	une
the	le / les	la / les

- Most adjectives go after the noun and not before it as they do in English e.g. un crayon bleu
- Most consonants are silent at the end of a word (d,g,m,n,p,s,t,x,z). Silent letters are highlighted in red.
