
DT (Making Roman Bread and Busts) Year 3, Term 4






This term the children will be learning about sculptures focusing on Roman bread and Roman busts.

Children will be focusing on designing their own busts, using other busts as inspiration, and they will then also evaluate their work.

Outcomes:

By the end of this unit you will have designed and made your own bust and Roman bread.

We will research how Roman bread is different to the bread we eat today and create our own recipe to then bake ready for a feast.

We will then research different key figures in the Roman emperor and how their busts looked and why. We will then look at creating our own out of clay.

- What ingredients are different? •
- How is the bread made?
- Is it made/ cooked differently?
