Nursery

What a busy term Robin Class have had! We started the term investigating the question 'Why do leaves turn crispy?' We all enjoyed

going on our very own autumn walk, hunting for different leaves and spotting other signs of autumn. It was great fun jumping in a big pile of leaves and listening to the different sounds they made.



Towards the end of the term, we explored

different celebrations: Diwali, Birthdays, Bonfire Night and Christmas. We even planned and held our own birthday party for our class mascot



Danny the Dog. The children were very engaged writing birthday cards, making decorations and baking cakes.
