Class News

<u>Nursery</u>

Robin class have enjoyed another fun filled term. It has been great finding out about different types of vehicles and imagining the different journeys we could go on. We have also been busy learning about Chinese New Year and the children all loved creating a dragon dance, tasting noodles and fortune cookies.



Our favourite stories this term have been 'The Naughty Bus' and 'Mr Gumpy's Outing'. The children have also become quite good at making up their own stories in our Talking Tales sessions. During maths lessons we have visited Ten Town and have been learning about the different characters that live there. These characters have been helping us to learn our numbers.



Reception

This term has flown by! The children have loved our topic of 'Journeys' and enjoyed learning stories, making their own vehicles and doing drama about different modes of transport.

We had a drama workshop on the picture book 'Journey' where we learned how to create freeze frames of pages from the book. We put these together with soundscapes created by Year 1 and thought alleys from Year 2 to make amazing scenes.

We have enjoyed reading the stories 'Whatever Next', 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'Shiver Me Timbers' (about a pirate ship!) and did some amazing writing about them.

We have used paint, junk modelling, play dough and mountains of paper to create artistic masterpieces about travelling and vehicles. We also loved having parents in for our shared lesson, making art inspired by our recent space theme. Thank you for coming.

In Maths we have been learning about time and adding and subtracting and have become so much more confident at forming numbers and using resources to help us. Well done!

We have welcomed Miss Hollidge into Reception as a new teacher covering Mrs Pile when she goes to have her baby after half term. We know she will have a great time with our fantastic children.

<u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 have enjoyed another busy term. In English, all the children have worked hard with their writing focusing on capital letters, finger spaces, full stops and have learnt some new grammar terminology e.g. prefix 'un' and suffix 'ing'. They have written a poem, a letter and enjoyed looking at the wordless book called 'Journey' by Aaron Backer. The children loved the drama workshop where they created different sounds for specific pictures.

For Careers Day the children had a visit from a police officer, a veterinary nurse and a community nurse. They were inspired by them and the children wrote what they would like to be when they grow up.

In History, children have enjoyed learning about Florence Nightingale. They drew a portrait of her and were able to discuss the conditions that Florence saw when she arrived at the Scutari Hospital and how she changed it for the better.

We have been very impressed with the children's enthusiasm to learn and all their hard work this term. Have an enjoyable and

fun break and come back refreshed, ready for more exciting learning.

<u>Year 2</u>

WOW, what a fantastic term we have had in Year 2! We have been busy learning all about 'The Great Fire of London'. We started off the term by receiving some old artefacts from 1666, including a quill and some smelly cheese! The children have impressed us with their recount and diary writing all about 'The Great Fire of London'. Then the children learnt the story of 'Very Little Red Riding Hood', they re-wrote the story and got creative with their own alternative ending.

In Maths, the children have been learning all about fractions, including how to find a half and a quarter of a number. They have also ordered numbers using the more than, less than and equal symbols. They have enjoyed recapping addition and subtraction of 2-digit numbers up to 100.

We enjoyed visiting St. Hugh's Church as part of our RE lessons this term. We had the opportunity to sketch the church, explore the artefacts and ask Reverend Smith lots of questions. Thank you, Reverend Smith, for allowing us to visit your church!

The children have created some beautiful watercolour landscapes as part of our learning week all based on the picture book 'Journey'. In our shared lesson this term, the children and adults created some Christopher Wren inspired collages with recycled newspaper and magazines. Thank you for giving up your time to help us!


The children have enjoyed looking at dance this term in their PE sessions. They have got stuck into each session, especially when we looked at the movement of fire! Finally, we loved making our own houses out of cardboard boxes. We then burnt the houses, which was a moment we won't forget!

Year 3

This term we have started to explore our new topic 'The Romans are coming!'. We have loved our new topic and we hope the children are excited to carrying on with it after half term.

In Maths, we have developed our multiplication and division knowledge, focusing on practical and formal methods of calculation. We have also spent time securing our addition and subtraction understanding. We really enjoyed our Maths Mastery shared lesson. Thank you to those parents who were able to come along.



In English, we embraced our inner Roman soldier and created letters home for our families. This involved us carrying out lots of research about what life would have been like for a Roman soldier. We have also created setting descriptions focusing on the wordless picture book 'Journey'.



PE this term has been great. We have really enjoyed focusing on both dance and hockey. The children have also taken part in an interhouse competition which was great fun.

A great start to 2020 Year 3. Keep it up!

<u>Year 4</u>

What a fantastic term it has been in Year 4. We are really enjoying our new topic all about Vikings and the children have written some excellent reports to share their learning. We have moved on in English to look at stories from different cultures. At the moment, we are writing stories based around 'Mufaro's Beautiful Daughter's'. In Science we have been studying 'States of Matter'. It has been fantastic to hear the questions and ideas that the children have and their enthusiasm to investigate different items and whether they could be a gas, liquid or a solid. The children have really enjoyed discussing reversible and irreversible changes to materials. Soon, we will be carrying out an experiment looking at the 'Water Cycle' so please keep an eye on our blogs to see what we get up to.

We had a great Drama and Arts week all based around the book 'Journey' in which the children created some interesting art, which retold the story, and got to act out their own interpretations of the pictures. They also wrote some amazing action sequences based on one of the pictures.



Wow Year 4! What an improvement! We are really pleased to see lots of children playing on Times Table Rock Stars and can see the impact this is having in our maths lessons. Please continue to log on and play. We hope you all have a great half term.

<u>Year 5</u>

What a busy start to the year!

Our topic this term is the Ancient Greeks. The children have been writing their own Greek myths and designing mythical beasts. Thank you to all adults that attended our shared lesson creating ancient Greek pots out of clay. We all enjoyed the opportunity to get creative and a little bit messy (we apologise for the state of some of the children's uniforms as a result!).

Mrs Thomas' class have continued their swimming lessons at Spiceball Leisure Centre and have all made excellent progress in the water. Meanwhile, Miss Fowler's class have been working with children from Frank Wise School to learn sign language and play team building games. The children have enjoyed these sessions on Wednesday afternoons and have now swapped.

In Science this term we have been learning about space. We have been researching planets and learning about how we get night, day and the four seasons. We are particularly excited about our trip to the National Space Centre next term!
