



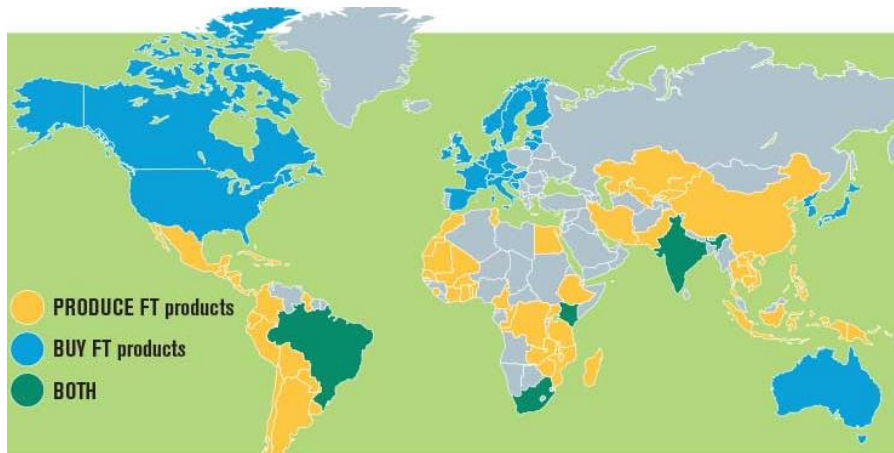
Harvest Festivals and Fair Trade

3. Fair Trade products have been available since 1994.
4. Harvest Festival is mainly a Christian Festival, but other religions have similar festivals.

6. Harvest Festivals are held all around the world from Australia to Sweden.
7. Harvest is from an Anglo-Saxon word "haerfest" which meant 'Autumn.'

Fair Trade Premium

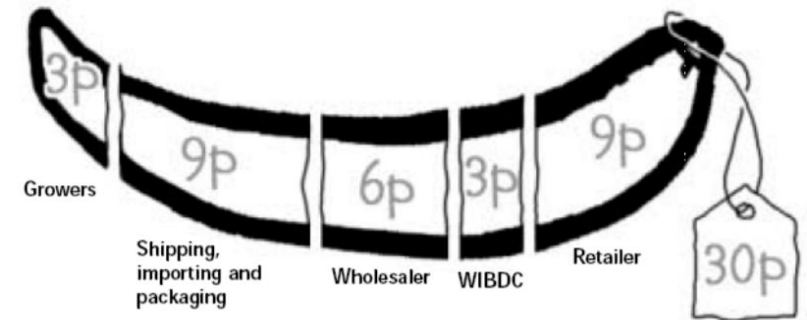
Fair Trade Premium Is an extra amount of money given to farmers to help them and their communities.

Wholesaler	Companies that sell the products to the retailer
Retailer	A place that sells products
Sukkah	A place that is decorated in the home that Jews use during Sukkot to celebrate
Congregation	People gathered for religious worship

Celebrations similar to Harvest in Christianity:

- Sukkot** = a Jewish festival
- Eid- al- Fitr** = a Muslim celebration
- Mabon** = a Pagan festival
