Sessions

Topic

Our topic this term is called '**Vroom, vroom, things with wheels**' where we will be focusing our learning around different vehicles, how they move and the marks in which they make in different textures. We are looking forward to changing our home corner into our very own bus station – '**All aboard!**'

Literacy

This term the children will be listening and encouraged to join in with talking about characters and the settings within our stories '**Mr Grumpy's Motor Car**' and '**The Naughty Bus**'. They will also be developing their mark making skills further with a variety of tools and will be giving meaning to the marks they make. As a class we will be continuing with our Little Wandle phonics and learning even more sounds.

Mathematics

This term in Maths, the children will practise their counting 1-10 in a range of contexts and will understand that things which cannot be moved, such as claps or jumps, can be counted too. We will be developing our awareness of numerals in the environment and will begin to match them to groups of objects. The children will also have fun learning about different 2D shapes and feeding them to our hungry shape monsters

Personal, Social, Emotional Development (PSED)

The children will continue to build on friendships they have already formed and develop new ones as we welcome more children to the class. They will also be learning different ways in which they can keep themselves safe inside and outside.

Wellies

Our outside area can become quite muddy as the weather continues to change. The children enjoy free flow throughout their school day; therefore, we strongly encourage the children to wear wellies when they are learning outside. Wellies can be left in school and should be clearly labelled with your child's name. We will go outside in all weathers so please ensure that children have a good waterproof coat in wet weather too.

Evidence Me

It has been so wonderful to see parents' comments on our Evidence Me observations as well as lots of uploads of home photo observations. We really enjoy receiving these and I know how much the children enjoy showing everyone during carpet sessions about things they have achieved or experienced so please keep them coming!

We are passionate about reading and we know just how important it is to instil a love of reading for pleasure into our children. Talking about the books you share will really help them develop a love of reading and important early reading skills.
