- Can I remind parents that if your child starts to show Covid symptoms at all on Friday 17th and Saturday 18th December and you get a positive PCR result, you must still notify us immediately via the office email address. We will then send the necessary warn and inform letters to families if they have had close contact with someone who has tested positive 48 hours prior to the

- symptoms starting. If your child develops symptoms from Sunday 19th December onwards and go on to get a positive test result, there is no need to inform us at that point as it is outside of the 48 hours period when the symptomatic child has been in contact with the school community, but obviously let us know on the first day back if they are off isolating.
- Our Nursery continues to go from strength to strength and is full, with a waiting list, from January to July 2022. So, if you have a child that you are thinking of sending to our Nursery from September 2022 onwards, we strongly suggest you make a booking to secure their place.

It has been another fun filled term in Nursery. Year 2

<u>Debbie's Diary</u>

The Household Support Fund (HSF) has been launched by the government to offer an important lifeline for vulnerable households who may struggle to afford life's essentials over winter.

Cherwell District Council will use the HSF to offer support to residents through a voucher scheme. Needs will be assessed, and vouchers issued by <u>Citizens Advice North Oxfordshire and South Northants</u> (CANOSN). The money will primarily be used to help pay for food, energy, and water bills for vulnerable households, but other costs can also be covered. The funds will be awarded according to individual circumstances. You can call the CANOSN Household Support Fund helpline on **0300 303 0993 and leave your details.**
