

As part of art this term we will be exploring **sculpturing**. We are going to be looking at the work by the artists called **Leo Sewell** and **Michelle Reader**.

We will be linking our art to our topic 'Animals from around the world.' The children will create a sculpture of an animal using a range of materials and techniques.

Vocabulary-	
sculpture	Creating figures or designs in 3D form
recycle	Recycled Art is creative work that's made from discarded materials that once had another purpose. Artists who make recycled art take those materials and make them into something new.
form	Experiment with constructing and joining recycled, natural and manmade materials.
shape	Create and arrange shapes appropriately.
technique	A way of doing something using special knowledge or skill.
materials	The items you use to make the sculpture which can be natural such as wood, stone or paper, or manmade such as metal and plastic.
processes	A series of actions or steps taken in order to achieve an end product.



- Materials that can be used for sculpturing:**
- paper
 - cardboard
 - wood
 - cardboard boxes
 - art straws
 - plastic bottles and lids
- Equipment needed to join materials.**
- scissors
 - glue
 - tapes to join and shape

Which materials will you use?

Are you going to paint your materials? Or cut and stick some materials?

What can you see in the sculpture?

Which colours are used?

Why do you think the artist made it?

How does the sculpture make you feel?
