

RE - Jesus the miracle maker



This term we will be focusing on Christianity, specifically looking at the miracles that Christians believe Jesus performed.

We will be learning about each miracle through listening to and watching stories, developing our understanding of why Jesus is so powerful to Christians.

Key vocabulary:

Jesus	In Christianity, Jesus is believed to be the son of God.
Miracle	An extraordinary event that cannot be explained by anyone. Christians believe it is done by God.
Christians	These are people who follow the religion of Christianity.
Bible	The bible is the holy book for Christianity. It is split into two sections; the old testament and the new testament.
Gospels	These are sections of the New Testament in the Bible, written by four of Jesus's disciples (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) to spread the 'good news' of Jesus' life.
Disciples	These are people who follow or learn from Jesus.


Key questions:
