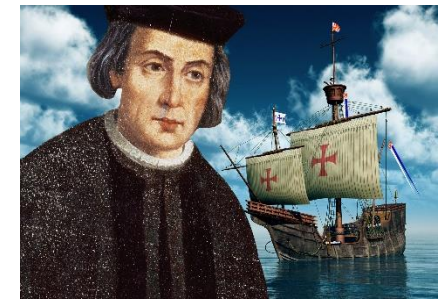




Explorers



Christopher Columbus	Neil Armstrong
Christopher Columbus was an explorer born in 1451 in Genoa, in Northern Italy.	Neil Armstrong was an astronaut born in 1930 in the state of Ohio, United States of America.
Columbus believed the Earth was round and decided to try and sail west from Europe to reach Asia.	1967 United States scientists began making plans for a moon landing and designed a new spacecraft called Apollo.
August 3rd 1492 three ships sailed west called the Santa Maria, the Nina and the Pinta.	Apollo 11 launched in 1969 it took off from the Kennedy Space Centre in Florida, USA.
12th October 1492 Columbus found an island and named it San Salvador	Apollo 11 was the first spacecraft to land on the moon.
He went on four voyages across the Atlantic Ocean.	21st July 1969 Neil Armstrong was the first person to walk on the moon.
Columbus became tired and ill and died in 1506. He never knew he had found a new continent, North America.	Neil Armstrong died in 2012 at the age of 82. Today, he still inspires modern astronauts.
