Head Teacher's News in Brief

Staffing:

As you will have read from our email last week, Mrs Thorpe is re-locating out of the area, so is leaving us on Friday 26th May. Mrs Thorpe has done a wonderful job covering classes across the school and will be missed. Our talented TAs will continue to do cover where needed.

Class allocations:

For those families new to Queensway, we always re-shuffle the classes each academic year. Teachers use their professional judgement based on what they know of the children within school. We cannot base our decisions on parental requests. We will always make the decision on what is right for the children and the cohort overall. Even if children are in the opposite class to someone they really want to be with, remember, they still have break and lunch times together as a year group. Thank you for your co-operation.

Parking permits:

Starting after half term, anyone using our staff car park will only be able to do so by displaying a valid parking permit up to 4:15pm each day. This will only be for people holding a disability badge or in some special circumstances, i.e., if a child is on crutches etc.

Year 6 walking to and from school:

After half term, some children in Year 6 may be allowed to walk to and from school without their parents. Parents must sign a contract to state they take full responsibility and if there are any reported incidents of poor behaviour en route, this privilege will be removed. Year 6 children cannot be responsible for bringing their younger siblings to school.

Reception and Nursery Sept 2023:

We are delighted to say that both our new Nursery and Reception classes are full from September. Therefore, if you have a child that is due to start nursery in the future, it is highly recommended that you apply for a place early.

Summer footwear:

Crocs and sliders are not permitted as school footwear as they don't provide enough support for children's feet. Black plimsols are suitable for indoors and black shoes for outdoors.

Book Fair:

The travelling Book Fair has been with us this term which always goes down well with the children. Did you know that your purchases earn the school rewards which they can spend on free books to stock up their library and classrooms? We are delighted to say that we raised £550.87 which is a fantastic amount. Thank you for your support.

Class News

<u>Nursery</u>

Wow.....we cannot believe how quickly Term 5 has gone for us in Nursery. Together we have been enjoying learning all about, how does your garden grow, turning our outside area into our very own 'Robins Garden Centre' where we experienced selling and buying flowers, plants, and vegetables. We planted our own beans and took on the responsibility of helping them grow as we watered them and made sure they had enough sunlight.

With great anticipation our caterpillars arrived, much to the children's delight. They used their speaking skills and knowledge to explain what happens for the caterpillars to eventually turn into beautiful butterflies before releasing them in the garden. We also learnt a song 'There is a tiny caterpillar on a leaf'. All the children joined in both with singing and had some great actions to support too!

We continued working hard in our phonics lessons, where our children are listening out for initial sounds in words, names, and objects through our 'What's in the box' and 'Bertha the bus' games. We are continuing to challenge them to hear blended words and have lots of fun in blending things for them to do with their bodies e.g., can you c-l-a-p your hands? We are very proud of their concentration and determination!

With all the successes in Nursery this term, we rewarded our children with a fantastic breakfast together, where we enjoyed delicious cereal, fruit and croissants, finishing off with a story.

Forest School has been a fantastic way to end each week on a high. Our children love the freedom of risk taking and challenging themselves, climbing trees, bug hunts, hammock swinging and cooking up some delicious muddy concoctions has kept the children engaged and focused come rain or shine.

We cannot believe we have one more term to go but I know it will be just as amazing as the ones before! We hope you all have a lovely half term, and we look forward to welcoming you back soon.







Reception Classes

This term has been so busy in Reception! We have had such a lot of fun learning about planting and growing. A highlight has been our trip to the allotment where the children were able to explore vegetables and plants that were growing. The plot owners showed them seeds and plants and spoke about what it was like to own an allotment. The children loved this and it motivated them to do lots of writing and role play around growing plants!

Another highlight of the term was the chick visits, which I'm sure you heard lots about! The chicks were part of our Reception for two weeks and it was so exciting watching them hatch and then change from tiny newborns, to slightly larger and much fluffier chicks. The writing that we gained from the children about the chicks was just amazing and the children showed such enthusiasm around our tiny friends!

We have covered lots of texts this term in English and the Enormous Turnip and Jack and the Beanstalk have been firm favourites. The children came into school to discover a beanstalk had grown over the weekend! They were so excited by this and couldn't wait to explore the world of the giant's castle more.

We loved having our shared lesson outside in Forest School this term and thank you to the parents that were able to attend. We have such fun exploring in nature and were so happy to share this experience with you. The Owl class have had the most amazing time exploring trees, hunting for bugs, making mud pies, blowing bubbles, playing games and having lots of fun in Forest School. The Dove class will be returning to Forest School after half term.







We cannot wait to start our final term in Reception. Have a lovely half term break.

Year 1

Wow, a short but hard-working term! The children have enjoyed our Science work all about plants. We made plants, labelled them, and learnt about the different parts and what their jobs are. We grew our own sunflowers and have now planted them in the Forest School area. We can't wait to watch them grow!





We had an amazing trip to Easington allotments. We even spotted newts in the pond! We have written our own information texts and poems about plants.

We have been outside creating some amazing sculptures based on the work by Andy Goldsworthy. The children really enjoyed making sculptures with their grown-ups in the shared lesson. The children have written their own amazing writing based on 'The Three Little Aliens'.

In Maths, we have been making equal groups and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We have also learnt about position and direction. Can you show a clockwise half turn or a whole turn?

In Geography, we have been travelling around different continents and have found out lots of interesting facts. We have looked more closely at our own country and learnt about England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.

Mr Grant's class have loved Forest School this term and Miss Fowler's class can't wait to get muddy at Forest School again after the half-term break. We are really looking forward to the next term and our new topic 'Meet the Veggies'.

Year 2

Another fantastic and busy term in Year 2. The children have really enjoyed our topics about the weather and habitats. They are all now fantastic weather reporters! They can also tell you lots about different habitats and the animals you might find there. They have enjoyed designing their own animals made from recycled materials. In English, they have relished writing adverts about habitats as well as writing their own stories based on the book 'Leaf'.

A fun morning was had by all during our multi-skills festival. The children got to play lots of new games and meet children from other schools. We also had a fun Science Week where the children got to watch a science show, visit the chicks, and carry out a Science investigation. They had to investigate 'Do snowmen melt quicker when wearing a coat?' Please ask them to tell you their results as we had some interesting conclusions.

In Maths, we have been working hard to consolidate all the key methods as well as apply these to written questions. We have been so impressed with how well they are writing out their calculations. We have finished the term off with our Maths shared lesson. Thank you to everyone who was able to attend.

Finally, we are really excited for next term and our trip to experience a Victorian Day. This should be a brilliant day where the children will get to take part in lots of different activities.

Year 3

This term in writing, we have innovated our own adventure stories based on the picture book 'Tuesday'. Our topic started off with frogs invading our classroom! This helped us to think of our own cheeky characters for our stories. The children thought carefully about each section of their story. We have also been writing biographies based on Henry VIII, which the children have thoroughly enjoyed.

In Maths this term, we have been busy focusing on measurement, including measuring lengths, masses, and capacity. The children have loved practising their skills and can now confidently convert between different units of measure.

Science week was a very exciting week for us, as we planned and carried out our own investigations. We worked hard to think about what we were trying to find out and what resources we needed. We then presented our results in a bar graph and wrote conclusions. The children also enjoyed seeing the chicks, learning more about their life cycle.









The children have loved focusing on 'Righteous Royalty' where they have been researching about different monarchs, including William the Conqueror and Henry VIII. The children even built their own castles, which fitted perfectly with our coronation celebrations.

Year 3 have enjoyed getting out in the sunshine and exploring cricket with Mr Mawn. The children have worked so hard to develop their skills that they even managed to play a game of cricket as a whole year group.

Year 3 have certainly worked extremely hard, and we hope you all have a well-deserved break.

Year 4

Well done to Year 4 for completing another busy and exciting term. They have all continued to work hard and we are very proud of them!

The children have been thoroughly enjoying their topic of Ancient Egypt so far – they are asking so many questions and coming into school with fascinating facts that they want to share from their own research. The children have learnt how to write their names in hieroglyphics inside a cartouche, created Tutankhamun's death mask and researched all about Howard Carter's wonderful discovery and its importance to our understanding of the ancient world.

The highlight of this term has been one particular demonstration that the children completed in Science, where they learned about the digestive system! It started with a banana sandwich, a foil tray, and a pair of scissors... The photographs say it all! The children have also written up their amazing knowledge about the topic using formal language in their non - chronological reports. Well done!







Thank you for another great term, Year 4. Enjoy a well-earned rest with your families.

Year 5

Year 5 have had a very busy term and have really impressed us with how resilient they have been. They have worked extremely hard, and this can be seen in the amazing work that they have produced.

This term, we have been learning about the natural disasters that occur on our planet: volcanoes, earthquakes, and tsunamis. The children have learnt about the structure of the Earth and why these natural disasters hit in certain places around the planet. We have also imagined what it would have been like to experience the infamous Mt Vesuvius eruption, in Pompeii, in 79AD and have used this to inspire our writing. The children particularly enjoyed writing their diary entries and worked hard to include many descriptive devices and 'show, not tell'.

In the final weeks of Term 5, the children began writing poems inspired by Mirolav Holub's poem, *The Door*. The children worked hard to think about how the structure of their poems supported the meaning and should be extremely proud of their final poems.

The children really impressed us with their Science Week investigations into the effect exercise can have on the human heart rate. They have been leading their own investigations and practising how to be 'real scientists in the field', writing predictions, considering different variables, recording their results, and thinking about what their findings mean.

They also thoroughly enjoyed our time with the chicks, and it was brilliant to see so many smiling faces.





In Art, we have been looking at the artwork of Hokusai, but have focused in detail on 'The Great Wave'. The children's imitations of the great wave were fantastic, and all children developed their skills whilst using pencil and water colours.

Year 6

Wow, what a busy term! Firstly, we would like to say a huge well done to all of the Year 6 children for their determination and resilience during their SATs. The children blew us away with their focus and dedication to their revision in the build up to their tests and they were calm and mature over the course of the week. They are all fantastic! We would also like to thank all of the parents and carers for their support over the year, particularly this term.

In our writing lessons, we have explored the book 'The Island'. The children wrote some wonderful descriptions and thought carefully about their tone, use of adventurous vocabulary and their use of a range of punctuation. The children used this text to write a description about the Stranger's arrival on the island; they used adjectives, adverbs, similes, and metaphors to create their writing.

The children have also enjoyed learning about how to use maps and compasses to navigate in their Geography lessons.

We have lots of exciting events and celebrations happening over the next term so please keep an eye out for the dates. The children will also have the opportunity to visit their secondary school for a transition day/s. Please ask if you are not sure when this is or if you would like more information.

We hope you have a lovely break, and we are looking forward to having you all back for your final term at Queensway!
