

Head Teacher's News in Brief

- We are very excited to say that Miss Hugo has got engaged. We wish her and Murray a very happy future together.
- We said goodbye to Mrs Evangelou in November. She has moved into secondary school support work which I am sure she will be amazing at! We have recruited Mrs Bosher to work in Year 2 who has already settled in and is part of the team.
- Our new club timetable for Terms 3 and 4 has now been published and will begin week commencing Monday 09/01/23.
- Christmas is always a busy period, which is why we don't set English and Maths homework, but please try to ensure you are still reading with your child as much as possible over the holiday as this is such a crucial skill.
- A huge thank you to everyone who has supported our Christmas events this year. There is a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes to make them such enjoyable events, so a big thank you to all the parents and staff for your contributions.
- Our Nursery continues to go from strength to strength and is full, with a waiting list from January to July 2023. So, if you have a child that you are thinking of sending to our Nursery from September 2023 onwards, we strongly suggest you make a booking to secure their place.
- Thank you to all the families who supported the book fair in November. It generated £245.00 in commission for us to spend on books in school.
- Children in Need also raised £358.00. Children had a wonderful day in their spotty outfits. The highlight was definitely the talent competition and Teddy Bear's picnic!
- You will have seen information in the news about Scarlet Fever and Information was sent out to all families last week. This letter can also be found on our school website if you missed it. If a

- doctor has confirmed it's Scarlet Fever, a child cannot return to school until 24 hours after they have started antibiotics and they are well enough.
- After a period of halting new bookings for After School Club due to large numbers attending, we have recruited more staff which has meant we have a few spaces available for families who wish to take out a contract for their child to attend. Please email childcare@queensway.oxon.sch.uk.
- A date for your diaries the next round of parent evenings will be Tuesday 14th March 3-7pm and Thursday 16th March 3-5:30pm. More information will follow nearer the time.
- We introduced a new phonics scheme in September called Little Wandle. We have been delighted to see how the younger children in the school are progressing in their phonics due to the successful implementation of the scheme. If parents want to find out more, please visit our school website and look in the 'learning and curriculum' section.
- Thank you for persevering with the heavy side gate. We have looked at a variety of options with the company to try and make this easier for the grownups to open. However, in order to keep the children safe whilst on site it needs to be a push button release followed by a manual opening. A fully automated gate wouldn't be feasible or practical given the amount of pedestrian traffic through it every day. So, if you see people with pushchairs or elderly struggling, please help by opening the gate for them.
- We have been delighted by the parental support since September at our shared lessons and class assemblies: 177 parents attend a shared lesson in Term 2 and 192 parents attend their child's class assembly. Year 2

What a wonderful Term 2 we have had in Year 2! All the children have been continuing to work super hard and have thoroughly enjoyed our Term 2 topics. Year 3

This term in Year 3, we have continued to enjoy learning about the Stone Age and the children are now knowledgeable historians and have had practice using a variety of different sources.

In English, we started the term by reading a variety of legends and identifying the features of them. We then learned to retell George and the Dragon. The children did an amazing job of using words and actions. We then created our own legend plans based on George and the Dragon and the children wrote a character description using adjectives and similes to describe their hero character. The children also wrote setting descriptions using imaginative words to paint a picture in the reader's mind. We have also used our knowledge of the Stone Age to write non-chronological report full of interesting facts.

In Maths, we have been learning about fractions, measurement, and shape. The children have worked hard to understand the new concepts that we have been learning and have enjoyed our hands-on, practical lessons which have helped them to learn important skills.

In DT, the children have been learning how to sculpt using different materials. The children enjoyed sculpting Stonehenge out of plasticine and made Stone Age necklaces using salt dough. We have also designed and made our own Stone Age camps using a range of different materials and techniques



In Science, we have been learning about Rocks, Fossils and Soils. The children enjoyed being 'Rock Detectives' and carried out investigations to try to find out the different rock

types. We also learned about the process of how fossils are formed and created our own



fossils using Plaster of Paris.

For Children In Need this year the children dressed up in spots and we had an enjoyable afternoon watching the talent show. We had a variety of acts, and it was lovely to see the children showcasing their talents.
