Welcome to Year 5

I hope you all had an enjoyable summer and are looking forward to the return to school. I am writing to introduce the Year 5 team and explain what we are going to be teaching in Year 5 up to Christmas.

Meet the team

Year Five Autumn curriculum is mostly based around our topic “Impact of war on Banbury”

English

Our writing across both Terms will be inspired by the experiences of children in World War 2 and we will be reading the novel, 'Goodnight Mr Tom'. We will be covering a range of genres beginning with how to create a character in a narrative. We will be looking at how authors use different techniques to bring their characters to life, including using dialogue, descriptive writing, and interaction with other characters. Later in the term, we will be looking at writing from the perspective of a character in the form of letters and diary entries. The children will be revisiting genres they have written before in their topic writing, including non-chronological reports. In Term 2, the children will be revisiting non-fiction genres and work to improve their use of a formal tone and technical vocabulary.

Mathematics

In maths in Term 1 we will be continuing to develop our mental maths strategies and practising tables (up to 12x12). We will focus on ordering and rounding numbers up to 1,000,000 and investigating negative numbers. We will also be re-visiting and learning new formal strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Other topics will include length, shape and direction, and time. In addition, the children will begin to extend their knowledge of equivalent fractions, convert between improper and mixed number fractions and compare and order fractions with the same denominator.

Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHCE)

We will begin the term with a unit of work called “Being my Best!”. This will include looking at Queensway as a community and thinking about the class community; we will also be thinking about ourselves and how we become the characters that we are. The children will also be encouraged to identify their own strengths and talents and areas that need improvement. They will learn how each of them has unique skills which make them individuals. Children will also be focusing on the unit of work ‘Me and my relationships’. During this unit, children will be looking at how to work collaboratively, understanding the importance of compromise and what makes strong friendships, including the qualities individuals need. Children will then explore relationships that can be unhealthy, ensuring they have a clear understanding of who they can talk to if they feel unsafe.

What homework to expect and when:

Homework will be given out on **FRIDAYS** to be handed in the following **THURSDAY**. Homework will consist of a Maths, English and Spelling task. We ask that children spend approximately 30 minutes on their maths and English homework and approximately 15 minutes on their spelling homework. Please can you encourage the children to keep the same standard of handwriting and presentation as their class books.

Ways you can help your child

- Please make sure that your children are reading at home. We will be sending home ways that you can help them by discussing their books. Please come and talk to us if you would like some advice about what your child should be reading. We continue to encourage children to read for 15-20 minutes each day.
- Practical activities such as counting money and getting involved in cooking at home, weighing and measuring can also be a great way for children to relate their maths learning to everyday life.

If there are any problems with homework, please do not worry and have a stressful weekend trying to get it done! We are always happy to have children bring the homework back before it is due in to talk through with us - this is a great habit to get into in preparation for secondary school.

Please feel free to come and ask questions of the staff in year 5 if you need to. We would ask that you avoid the mornings as this is a busy time and we try to get teaching underway promptly.

I look forward to working in partnership with you all this year.
