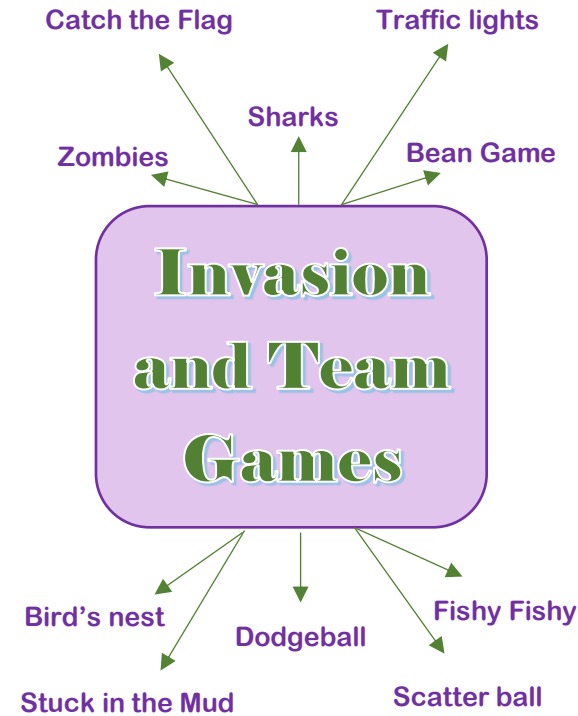
Key Vocabulary and Skills

Invasion	Invasion is when a game has someone who is trying to attack their opponent's territory and score a goal or point.
Attacker	The job of the attacker is to score as many points or goals as they can without being stopped by an opponent. Attackers work as a team to plan how they can work together to score.
Defender	The job of the defender is opposite to the attacker. They are working against the attacker to try to stop them scoring any goals or points.
Teamwork	The children will be working as part of a team to attack the other team and score, as well as defend from the other team scoring against them.
Communicating	Communication is the key skill we will be working on this term. The children will practise talking to each other while playing.

The children are going to use the skills they practised in term 1 and 2 (striking, kicking and throwing) to work as a team to play invasion games successfully. They will be developing their knowledge about defending and attacking to play games with more players.
