



Overview

Art comes in many different forms but all art can be grouped into 2 or 3D. These refer to the dimensions of the artwork. 2D art is flat, such as a sketch, painting, illustration or a print. 3D artwork is solid and can be touched, lifted and walked around. We usually see these types of art in the form of sculptures/ statues. They can be made from wood, stone, metal or other materials which can be shaped. We will be making an Egyptian inspired sculpture using junk materials.

Key vocabulary:

Sculpture- to make or represent a form by shaping, casting or moulding.

Collage – a piece of artwork created by layering and sticking different pieces of material and media together.

Texture – the feel or appearance of a material or object.

Technique - the particular method or way of doing or performing something.

Self- portrait- a painting or other representation that someone makes of themselves.

Front profile- when you look at the front view of a person. You will see all of their facial features.

Side profile- when you look at someone' face from the side. You will see one eye, one cheek and the side of the nose and mouth.
