## Key vocabulary and spellings

O\$ symbols — recognisable symbols which are used across the Ordnance survey mapping network.

**Agriculture** – the farming of crops or animals. **Early settlers** — the first people to settle in an area e.a Romans, Anglo Saxons and Vikings **Healthcare** — includes doctors, dentists, hospitals etc.

**Industrial** — businesses that provide services or products.

**Leisure** - time spent away from working,

**Retail** – shops selling products to people **Settlement —** a village, town or city where people live.

#### Romans

- -chester = castle
- -cester = castle

### Anglo-Saxons:

- -ham = village
- -ton = farm
- -ford = river crossing

- -by = village
- -thorpe = farm
- -toft = house
