Dear Parents,

We hope you all had a lovely Easter break and have enjoyed some family time.

Topics

Our topics this term are 'How does your garden grow?' and in Term 6 'Meet the veggies'.

Year 1 Summer curriculum

English

This term the children are focusing on traditional tales and non-fiction texts. They will be exploring different traditional tales as well as alternative tales and using our topic we will be looking at the different parts of trees and applying what we are learning in Science to our English writing. We will be continuing to focus on our sentence structure and using our phonics to help us spell words, as well as focusing on all our phonics sounds to ensure our understanding and knowledge of each of them. We will also be working on correctly punctuating our sentences and using capital letters and full stops accurately.

Mathematics

This term the children will be continuing to develop their knowledge of number, multiplication and division and addition and subtraction. They will also be beginning to learn about money and the different denominations, which is a new concept within Year One. We will also be working on position and direction as well as half, quarter and three-quarter turn. We will then move onto money and recognising the value of different coins.

Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHCE)

Children will be exploring our rights and responsibilities. We will be thinking about why we have rules, who is special to us and what makes them special, how we take care of something that is special to us and basic first aid. In term 6 we will be looking at growing and changing and positive relationships.

To find out what we are learning in all the other subject areas, please look at the *Knowledge Organisers* which can be found on Google Classroom.

Homework

Thank you for supporting your child with their homework. The work set consolidates the learning that has happened during the week in school, it is clear to see how hard the children have been working on the tasks set. **Homework is set on Fridays and is due in the following Thursday.**

Homework is sent home as follows:

- Reading- All children are expected to read for at least 5 minutes each day with an adult.
- Spelling- Your child will bring home spellings in their homework folders every other week with a <u>list of spellings</u> to practice. Please encourage them to use a variety of strategies such as creating these words with a variety of resources such as twigs, magazine cuttings and pasta, as well as looking at each word, covering it and practice writing it, then checking it. Phonics are every other week. Regular spelling practice of a few minutes each night will make a big difference to your child's confidence and ability.
- **Maths** Children are set one piece of maths homework to consolidate the work we have been doing in class that week, please ensure that they are doing 15 minutes of this a week.

Phonics

During term 6 your child will be sitting the Government phonics screening check which all Year 1 children in the country do. The best way to prepare your child is to listen to them reading their schoolbooks daily as these are all phonetically decodable.

Reading

Thank you for hearing your child, it makes a huge difference. Daily reading at home is essential as it reinforces the work the children complete in school and allows them to practise skills introduced in lessons.

We will change your child's book if it is put in the book bag box. We recommend that they read the book at least once for fluency, and then a second time for comprehension and thirdly for expression. Remember to ask them lots of questions about what they have read.

Well done to all those children who have received their bronze, silver, gold, platinum and commended reader certificate. Keep up the hard work. Please can you make sure you are signing in the children's diaries to say you have listened to them read at least 5 times a week. This can be their reading book from school or a book from home. Have a look at the recommended reading list that was sent home last term (and is on the website) for some ideas of what your child could read.

If your child reads five times a week, they also get a sticker to go on their reading chart, 5 stickers would mean that they have read 25 times and will then get a certificate presented to them in our Key Stage One Assembly. Certificates are awarded as follows:

25= Bronze 50= Silver 75= Gold 100= Platinum 125= Commended Reader 150= Reading Worm

PE days

Both of our PE lessons are outdoors, our lessons will be on Wednesday and Friday. Your child must not wear any jewellery on these days. Please can you make sure that they have appropriate clothing for PE in school all of the time. As it is outside; warm outside kit is particularly important as we will go out each week unless we have extreme weather.

• Outdoor kit: Plain navy shorts or tracksuit bottoms and plain white T-shirt plus plimsolls/trainers. You can also provide a navy fleece or tracksuit top for cold weather.

Forest school

We will not be doing forest school in Term 5, however forest school sessions will resume on Fridays in Term 6.

Please ensure that all clothing brought into school is clearly named.

Events this term

- Our class assembly will be on Friday 28th April at 2:30pm in the hall.
- Parent's Evening has also been rescheduled for Friday 28th April. Bookings can be made online or at the school office. If you are unable to attend on this day then please come and speak to me at drop off or collection so that we can arrange another convenient time.
- On **Friday 30**th **June**, parents will be invited to a class exhibition at **2:30pm** in the hall. This will be an opportunity for the children to share their work with you and celebrate their learning over the year.

Shared lessons

Our shared lesson in Term 5 will be an Art lesson on Thursday 11th May at 2pm. Our shared lesson in Term 6 will be a Maths lesson on Tuesday 27th June at 2pm.
