



What is the Stone Age?

The Stone Age was a prehistoric period of time that was split up into three periods (Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic).

Humans used tools and weapons, made out of stone, to survive. These humans were called 'hunter gatherers' which means they had to hunt for their food. This meant that they moved around very often as they had to follow the animals and find where the best berries were.

Pre- historic	This refers to a period of time before anything was written down or recorded.
Era	A length of time covering many years.
Palaeolithic era	The first phase of the Stone Age.
Mesolithic era	The second phase of the Stone Age.
Neolithic era	The third phase of the Stone Age.
Archaeologist	A person who digs up artefacts and then studies them to learn about the past.
Settlement	A place where people create a community.
Spear	A pole weapon with a sharpened head.
Flint	A type of rock used to create fire.
Harpoon	A long spear used for fishing.
Cleaver	A tool used to dig up soil and cut up meat and animal skin.
Stonehenge	This is a famous monument that was created in the Stone Age. No one knows why it was built, but many believe it was used for religious reasons.
Skara-Brae	A settlement/ village created in the Neolithic era.
