Nursery

We have had the most amazing start to the school year and could not be prouder of all the children and how they have settled into Nursery life so happily and independently. Together they are forming some lovely friendships that I know will continue to blossom as well as becoming familiar with our daily routine and carrying out our class rules.

Carpet times have been a big success where the children have been singing beautifully during 'what's the song in my bag' familiarising themselves with new nursery rhymes as well as their favourite ones too. Communication and listening skills have blown us away through our Welly Wednesday walks where we have been tuning into outside sounds. Together we have taken our much-loved stories of this term 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear' and 'Little Red Hen' where we have searched high and low with our nursery made binoculars and magnifying glasses for clues to find the animals. This took our excitement and determination to another level!

Daily counting of our children and number songs are extending our counting even further. All the children are working really hard with using their fingers to help them too which has been so lovely to see.

Reception

We can't believe we have finished our first term in Reception. The children have settled into life at Queensway so well and we are so proud of everything they have achieved already.

We have started our Phonics lessons this term and the children have really impressed us. They are recognising the sounds that we are learning and have recently started blending them to read and write whole words. We know that you are just as proud of the children as we are when you hear them reading their Phonics books at home.

Forest School has been a particular highlight for the children in Owls Class. They have been bug hunting, den building, stick collecting, cooking up creations in the mud kitchen, exploring the woods, bird watching and storytelling. We know that Doves Class will have an equally amazing time when they venture down to Forest School next term.

Another highlight of the term has been the 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' story. The children had the most amazing time re-telling the story out and about on the school field! We had bubbly snowstorms, squelchy mud and narrow, gloomy caves that we tiptoed through.

We have loved welcoming people into the classrooms this term. We have had the Police, a parent from Australia and most recently grandparents and grown-ups for shared lessons. Thank you for coming and sharing your memories of childhood games and toys. The children loved sharing this special time with you all.

We hope you all enjoy a very well-deserved rest in half term!

Year 1

The children have had a fantastic start to Year 1 and have all settled in well. They have loved our Geography work all about the seaside and it has been great to find out about the different places they have visited.

They have also enjoyed naming and describing materials. The children had fun carrying out an experiment to find which material would stop teddy from getting wet in the rain! The children have wowed us with their writing and have loved learning to recite text maps including 'Panda Bear, Panda Bear' and 'Sounds'. In Maths, we have been consolidating the children's number knowledge as well as naming and describing 3D shapes.

1FL have had a fantastic time at Forest School and 1LM are looking forward to starting Forest School next term. Both classes were amazed at the number of adults who attended our shared lessons. It was a great opportunity to show parents how excited the children are to be learning to read and how we teach phonics. Thank you to everyone who was able to attend. We are really excited for next term and hope you all have a lovely half term.

Year 2

What a fantastic, busy first term the children have had. They have been working incredibly hard and have settled into Year 2 fantastically.

In English they have been writing letters to our pen pal Lakshmi in India and have especially enjoyed writing about the animated film 'The Windmill Farmer'. In History we have been finding out about harvests in the past and have been comparing it to harvest today. The children were shocked to find out that children as young as 6 worked on the farms for up to 10 hours a day to cut the wheat and scare away birds.

The children have also worked incredibly hard in Maths, increasing their confidence and fluency with addition and subtraction problems and their understanding of place value. After half term, we will be introducing Times Table Rockstars.

In Geography, the children have been finding out about India and making comparisons between the United Kingdom, Banbury and New Delhi. They have learnt about the different types of weather and seasons in India and different physical and human features such as the Taj Mahal, the Ganges River and the Himalayan mountains. Additionally, it was wonderful to see so many adults attend the shared lesson where the children loved making their Rama and Sita inspired puppets and practising their sewing skills.

We are really looking forward to next term and the Year 2 Nativity. More information will be sent out after half term. We hope you all have a lovely, restful half term.

Year 3

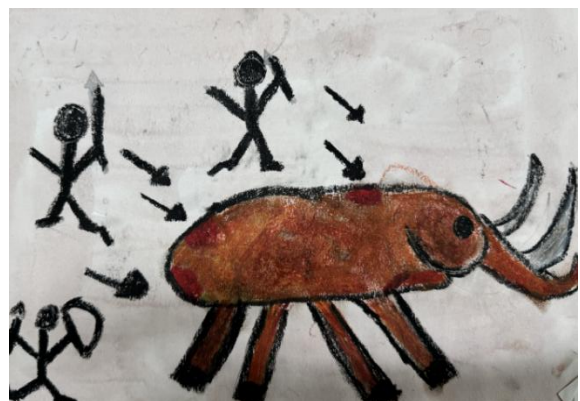
We have had a very busy first term in Year 3. The children have been working hard and have settled well.

In Writing this term, we have been reading the book 'Stone Age Boy'. The children wrote some amazing diary entries imagining that they had visited the Stone Age for the day. Lots of the children chose to tell hunting and gathering stories through their diary entries. Later in the term, we enjoyed reading 'How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth' and learned how to re-tell the story using actions. We then learned about the features of instructions and used our imaginations to come up with our own creative set of instructions for how to wash a woolly mammoth.

In Maths, we started the term learning all about place value. We enjoyed creating numbers using different equipment and learning how to order and compare 3-digit numbers. We then moved on to learn how to solve addition and subtraction calculations using the column method. The children worked hard on this method and became confident at following the calculation steps. We have also been learning about multiplication and division and the children have worked hard on learning how to use the grid method and number line to support them.

In History this term, we have been learning about the Stone Age. The children have enjoyed working as historians to explore the tools that people made during the Stone Age and discovering how they lived. We also enjoyed learning about Stonehenge and how it was built and why it was a special place for people. The children have worked hard on their topic both in school and at home and are always eager to share the additional research they have conducted or resources they have made.

In Art, the children have created some fantastic cave paintings, as well as silhouettes of Stonehenge at sunrise and sunset. In our recent Shared Lesson, the children enjoyed telling stories of the Stone Age through art, using oil pastels. They came up with some really imaginative story ideas and enjoyed bringing their stories to life.



Year 4

This term, the children have been busy learning all about the Anglo-Saxons and what their lives would have been like. During this learning, the children even became Anglo-Saxons themselves and wrote diary entries about their day. They have really enjoyed learning about the past and turning into archaeologists to discover and make inferences about Anglo-Saxon artefacts. The children were particularly fascinated to learn that Banbury, Grimsbury and Oxford are all Anglo-Saxon place names!

In English, the children have been extremely busy with descriptive writing based around our class novel 'Narnia – The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'. The children have written some fantastic setting and character descriptions focusing on Narnia itself and the White Witch. We then wrote non-chronological reports about our own hybrid animals that we have created. The children really embraced their formal tone of a non-fiction text. We then finished the term by creating our own fantasy stories. The children have certainly been busy!

In Maths, they have been focusing on developing place value knowledge, building on from what the children have learnt in previous years. We have then developed our fluency and reasoning skills with addition and subtraction and it is fair to say that we are now all 'Column Experts'.

Linking to our topic of Anglo-Saxons, the children researched and designed their own Anglo-Saxon brooches. They really enjoyed having the opportunity to then create these brooches during our shared lessons.



In Science, we have enjoyed focusing on the topic of 'Sound' and particularly enjoyed using musical instruments to investigate how low and high-pitched sounds are made. The children finished the term by carrying out an investigation into which material would be the best for soundproofing a music studio for a band. We then wrote about our findings in a letter to the band.

We certainly have been extremely busy settling into Year 4 and cannot wait to continue our learning after half term. We would like to wish you an enjoyable half term.

Year 5

What a wonderful half term we have had in Year 5. The children have settled back into school life fantastically and are thoroughly enjoying their first topic, World War Two, in which they have learnt about key events, such as the Blitz and the evacuation of children. In writing, we have been so impressed with the children's work, where they have created character and setting descriptions, diary entries and letters, paying particular attention to detail. In addition, the children have also worked hard to create a piece of artwork inspired by Henry Moore, using watercolour and wax resist.

With the helping hands of their parents and grandparents, the children enjoyed creating their Blitz artwork as part of our Shared Lesson. It was so lovely to see them working together and being proud of the outcomes of their hard work and effort.

Finally, in PE the children have worked on their TAG Rugby and gymnastic skills. We are so proud of how the children represented Queensway School at the Cross Country and TAG Rugby events, all showing fantastic sportsmanship!

Year 6

What a fantastic first term we have all had in Year 6, with the children settling in brilliantly. Our first topic has taken us on a discovery of the rainforest, with the children spending their geography lessons learning about the layers of the rainforest and the different animals that live within this extraordinary habitat. The children then researched and presented their learning when they produced some fantastic posters in a group, showing clear teamwork, creativity and knowledge. This was also the inspiration for our shared lesson dioramas,

which we had the great pleasure of experiencing with so many parents. Thank you so much for joining us and for all your help, it was wonderful to begin the term in this way. Additionally, the children have clearly been motivated by this topic, as they wrote their narratives which were set in the Amazon Rainforest. It has been wonderful to see how much they have enjoyed this through their writing with their imaginations coming to life on the page for the reader.

In Maths, the children have been working hard and developing their confidence with formal written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division, then applying this knowledge to solve a range of problems.

Finally, the children had such fantastic experiences during their time away on the Year 6 residential. We were very proud of the children's resilience and how they pushed themselves to achieve new goals. Whilst they were away, the children at school immersed themselves in a Titanic research project and created some fantastic clay models, sketches and research posters.
