Dear Parents,

We hope that you all had a wonderful Easter and enjoyed some special time together with family and friends. We look forward to starting Term 5 and watching the children grow and learn even more.

Reception Summer curriculum

This term our topic is called 'How does your garden grow?' where we will be exploring lots of plants and growth. In Term 6, our topic will be 'All creatures great and small' where we be focusing on animals of all shapes and sizes. Please visit our Google Classroom to find the full Knowledge Organiser that we have created for this topic outlining exactly what your child will be learning.

English
The children will be exploring their topic through a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts including: Farmer Duck, Jack and the Beanstalk, Bean Diary and non-fiction writing about chicks. We will also be moving forward in our Little Wandle phonics scheme where the children will be reading and writing a variety of longer words and learning a new range of tricky words. We will be encouraging children to read and write simple sentences independently.
Mathematics
The children will learn how to make numbers in different ways with a particular focus on numbers 9 and 10. We will be looking at the number bonds to ten. Children will also explore different units of measure: including length, height, time and money. We will continue to practice our counting skills daily.
Personal, Social, Emotional Development (PSED)
This term, we will be exploring 'Rights and Respect' in our circle time lessons. We will be looking at how we can take responsibility for our environments, both inside and outside. We will be using the Michael Recycle story to help us with this learning. We will also be looking at how we can look after the people around us, make them feel positive and show them respect.

What homework to expect and when

Children will continue to receive one piece of Maths and one piece of Phonics homework every Friday. These are to be completed by the following Thursday. We do not need the paper copies of the homework back, as photos and videos of homework being completed should be submitted to Evidence Me. Please let us know how your child gets on with their homework in the notes section on Evidence Me.

Children will also continue to bring home a phonics reading book and a book from our class library for them to share with you. As stated in the letter from Miss Peniston, which you should have received at the end of last term, we will no longer be doing our reading reward scheme. If you have any questions about this then please ask.

Evidence Me:

We have really enjoyed reading and sharing in class observations from home. The children get a real buzz out of showing their friends what they do. Please continue to take an active role in contributing to your child's observation portfolio by uploading your own observations. These could be of things that your child has practised at home, skills they have learnt, trips or outings you have been on as a family, or just anything exciting that you want to share! Some examples of observations we have seen are cooking, riding a bike without stabilisers for the first time, visiting the dentist, arts and crafts at home and lots of lovely family outings.

PE days:

Our regular PE slot will continue to be on a Tuesday morning. We hope to be outside more often in the nicer weather so please make sure that your child has an appropriate PE kit in school every week. PE uniform is a navy short/joggers and a plain white T-shirt. The children will also need a pair of trainers.

Term 5 will see the Owls return to Forest School with Mrs Bytyci. We are hopeful that the weather will start to improve, but please still send the children appropriately dressed for each session. Please refer back to the initial letter informing you of the appropriate layers to wear in the different weather conditions. Doves will return to Forest School in Term 6.

Spare Clothes

It would be really useful if every child has a spare set of uniform (especially underwear) in school just in case. Please make sure that these clothes are also clearly named.

Sunhats, sun cream and water:

As the weather warms up over the next few weeks, we would like to ask that your child comes to school with a named sunhat. It would be helpful if you could also put sun cream on your child before they start school on warmer days. If you are sending them in with their sun cream bottle, please ensure that it is clearly named. The bottles will be kept in the teacher's cupboards at school for use when needed. We would also remind you that we encourage the children to be bringing in a named water bottle for them to access during the day too. This is particularly important as the weather warms up. Please only send water into school and not squash, fizzy drinks or juice.

Term 5 and 6 shared lessons

In term 5, to link with our planting and growing topic, we will be inviting parents in for a shared lesson with a focus on outdoor learning. We would like to invite parents to join a Forest School session.

- Owls shared lesson in Forest School will be **8.45 – 10.00am on Monday 22nd April.**
- Doves shared lesson in Forest School will be **8.45 – 10.00am on Wednesday 24th April.**

There will be no shared lessons in Term 6.

Forthcoming trip

In term 6, the children will be having a visit from 'Zoolab' to coincide with the work that we will be covering on animals. Each class will be taking part in a 50 minute workshop guided by a Zoolab ranger where the children will meet a range of mammals, insects, amphibians and arachnids. This visit will happen on Tuesday 25th of June. A letter will be sent with details of costings this week.
