- A huge thank you to everyone who has supported our Christmas events this year. Lots of work goes on behind the scenes to make them such enjoyable events, so a big thank you to all the parents and staff for your contributions.
- Thank you to all the families who supported the book fair in November. It generated £510.38 in commission for us to spend on books in school.
- Children in Need also raised £293.09. Children had a wonderful day in their spotty outfits. The School Council did a great job organising fun events throughout the day.

<u>Nursery</u>

I am not sure where this term has gone, it has whizzed by!!!! We started it with filling the room with lots of paint and glitter to celebrate Halloween, Bonfire night and Diwali. The children became very inquisitive whilst exploring the different pumpkins and enjoyed using their fine and gross motor skills to hammer in tees, before investigating the *'slimy'* inside! I was amazed at how quickly the firework poem was learnt by all; I hope you enjoyed watching their well-rehearsed performance.

All the children have made a positive start to their phonics learning. Together, listening out for different sounds in the environment and singing much loved nursery rhymes as well as learning some new ones too. Some of our children are really tuning in and beginning to hear the first sound in words. They especially enjoy it when I ask them to do something with my robot voice, (can you h-o-p, j-u-m-p?)

Our favourite stories this term have been the Gruffalo and the Tiger That Came To Tea. We have been on autumn walks around the school during our Welly Wednesday sessions, crunching through various shaped leaves hunting for the different animals, we are sure we spotted the Gruffalo behind the big trees! We have used our mark making skills to design missing tiger posters and to write tea party invitations, which was finished with our very own snack tea party!

We are becoming good experts as we focus on our counting ensuring we take our time when pointing to different objects and using our fingers to support us throughout Maths carpet sessions and throughout busy bird time too!

Youth Activators have been a huge hit with us all on a Tuesday as we have learnt different active games to keep us fit and healthy. Taking the dragons eggs and fruit salad have been the firm favourite and we look forward to continuing this throughout Term 3.

I could not be prouder of how much the children have all grown in confidence and independence and cannot wait for them to flourish even more after the Christmas break.

I hope you all have a wonderful Christmas and look forward to seeing you in the New Year.



Reception Classes

We have had a fantastic term in Reception and the children are really amazing us everyday with their learning.

<u>Year 1</u>

We have had a brilliant Term 2! All children have continued to work hard, take responsibility for their learning, and have started to work independently. We have loved learning about Florence Nightingale in our History topic and especially enjoyed our Florence workshop. Thank you so much to all the adults for helping fund this workshop.

In English we have been busy learning about how to write a recount, instructions, and a non-fiction report. We especially enjoyed creating our own instructions on 'How to Catch a Dragon'. During all our writing we have been continuing to work hard on using finger spaces, full stops and capital letters but also applying our phonic knowledge. Please ask us about our writing and encourage us to keep writing at home!

In Maths we have been learning about different measurements including capacity, volume, length, and mass. We have loved all our practical lessons getting to use our knowledge to real life scenarios e.g. measuring the lengths of different objects in our classroom. Finally, we have been building our knowledge of adding and subtracting numbers and refreshing ourselves on different methods we can use e.g. number lines and part-whole models. Thank you so much to all the adults who came to our Maths shared lesson. We enjoyed showing off our knowledge to you and enjoying lots of Maths activities together.

We have loved continuing to learn about materials in Science. We carried out investigations with the bottle people we had made, experimenting with different materials to keep them warm and dry on their adventures. We also have enjoyed learning about Autumn and Winter this term and how we can spot the signs of each season starting.


1MD have great fun in their Forest School sessions this term and I know 1SB/LL are excited to return to Forest School next term.

Year 2

What a wonderful term we have had in Year 2! All the children have been continuing to work super hard and have thoroughly enjoyed our Term 2 topics. We have been finding out lots about the famous 'Gunpowder Plot' in History and we even got to ask Guy Fawkes some questions via Google Classroom!

In Art, we have been exploring mixing colours and the work by Wassily Kandinsky. The children enjoyed using the primary colours to mix paint to create a wonderful final piece based on his work.

In English, the children have been exploring lots of different genres of writing including poems, factual writing, and narratives. They have enjoyed innovating the story 'The Papaya that Spoke' and lots of the children used adjectives to describe the characters and setting. They also created some lovely writing based on the poem 'If I had Wings'. We have been blown away by the children's imagination and this is starting to show in their creative writing!

In Maths, we have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes. We have been exploring their different properties and grouping them based on these. The children also enjoyed learning about length and they estimated and measured accurately. The children have been very enthusiastic about Timetable Rockstars this term. Remember to keep playing at home and collecting those coins!

In our Science lessons, the children have been looking at animals including humans and the changes that happen to animals as they get older. They have also been exploring healthy eating and they enjoyed their 'food' Science workshop with Science Oxford last week. Thank you to all the adults who attended our shared lesson. We hope you had a great time!

It is good to see that so many children are now receiving their silver certificate for reading 5 times a week for 10 weeks. Please remember to sign in their reading diary when they have read at home so the children can gain their stars and certificates.

Finally, what a wonderful end to Term 2 we had with our Nativity performance. We were so proud of all the Year 2 children for their performance and we hope that you enjoyed seeing the children on stage. 
Year 3

This term in Year 3, we have continued to enjoy learning about the Stone Age and the children are now knowledgeable and have had practice using a variety of different sources. They particularly enjoyed learning about the Stone Age settlement of Skara Brae in the Orkney Islands during our Geography lessons.

In English, we started the term by reading a variety of legends and identifying the features of them. We then learned to retell George and the Dragon and the children did an amazing job of using words and actions. We then created our own legend plans based on George and the Dragon and the children wrote a character description using adjectives and similes to describe their hero character. The children also wrote setting

descriptions using imaginative words to paint a picture in the reader's mind. We have also used our knowledge of the Stone Age to write non-chronological report full of interesting facts. We then finished the term by writing some Stone Age house adverts using rhetorical questions and appealing language to sell some rather unappealing houses!

In Maths, we have been learning about fractions, measurement and shape. The children have worked hard to understand the new concepts and have enjoyed our hands on, practical lessons which have helped them to learn important skills. The children particularly enjoyed making 3D shapes and learning about the properties of them.



In Science we have been learning about Rocks, Fossils and Soils. The children enjoyed being 'Rock Detectives' and carried out investigations to try to find out the different rock types. We also investigated different types of soil and the children enjoyed digging two soil samples to investigate which held water the best.

3KR/RE have also been busy down at Forest School. The children have become master den builders, potion makers and bug hunters. It has been great to see the children get stuck in and watch their friendships grow outside of the classroom.





<u>Year 4</u>


What another busy and exciting term! We have been very impressed with the children's enthusiasm towards our topics and their willingness to try and challenge themselves in all curriculum areas.

In English this term, we have worked hard on our cross-curricular writing, composing persuasive texts about a class pet, researching, and writing non-chronological reports about sound and designing safety posters to ensure people know about the dangers around electricity. The children's knowledge and understanding of the technical vocabulary has been great!

As part of our Geography topic this term, the children have learnt all about maps and how these are created before using this knowledge to create their own map of Queensway School.

In DT, the children have also worked hard to use their learning from last term all about Anglo Saxon jewellery and the designs used, to create their own Anglo Saxon inspired brooch out of clay.

In Science, the children have been learning all about electricity and have thought carefully about what is needed to create a simple circuit along with which materials allow electricity to pass through and which do not.



This term, we have also had the fantastic opportunity to take part in creating our very own school song. The children thoroughly enjoyed mixing sounds together to create their own backing tracks which were then used to create a whole school song. We are all looking forward to hearing once it is completed!

<u>Year 5</u>

In Year 5, the children have had another great term and have really impressed us with their knowledge and enthusiasm for the different topics!

This term, the children have continued to explore World War II and the impact this had on the lives of British civilians. They have created some excellent non-chronological reports about women in war, have written their own persuasive leaflets focusing on the importance of Anderson shelters, as well as designed and created their own propaganda posters and fact files about the Windrush generation! They have become very knowledgeable about the topic and have lots of information to share.

As part of the topic, the children also visited the Banbury Museum and explored the impact of World War II in Banbury. They had lots of opportunities to handle real artefacts, understand the different roles taken during the

war, as well as explore the museum, developing their understanding of the critical role Banbury played! The children thoroughly enjoyed dressing up and getting hands-on with the artefacts.



In DT, the children continued to apply their understanding of History, designing, and creating their very own Anderson shelters. The children worked hard to include the key aspects of an Anderson shelter, with many considering how to fasten and protect their shelters from impact.

<u>Year 6</u>

Wow! What a fantastic term we have had in Year 6. The children have worked extremely hard and are trying to build their resilience in order to be prepared for the challenges ahead.

Our learning has been filled with interesting topics that range from the Mayan Civilisation to Charles Darwin's theory of evolution and inheritance. The children have really enjoyed having the chance to research Charles Darwin and investigate how his theory of evolution changed modern Science. They have completely emersed themselves in the topic by writing biographies about Darwin and have been examining fossils through the eyes of a palaeontologist; they were even able to take part in STEM Science live lesson which linked to their Science learning about classification.

In History, the children have been discovering what life was like for the Mayan Civilisation. They have studied artefacts, images and written information to learn about their architecture, culture and religious beliefs. We were even lucky enough to have a special visitor who talked to the children about their visit to Chichén Itzá and showed first-hand images of the Mayan ruins.

Some children had the privilege of attending The Geography Game Show at Tudor Hall. The morning was filled with exciting opportunities to develop our geographical knowledge and skills. We learnt about the locations of key areas around the world, and how to remember these, and we even won a few prizes!

To finish the busy term, the children performed in the Queensway Carol Concert and did themselves proud. They worked hard to learn the songs and the final performance was a joy to watch. We hope that the children have a restful winter break and come back ready to begin the new year of learning.

Community Albums Project

As part of our work to renew our Artsmark award, we have been working with a charity called Community Albums on an exciting song writing project. We were fortunate enough to be able to secure funding from the Better Lives Through Culture Fund through Cherwell District Council. Community Albums visited first on Friday 10th November and worked with each class in Year 4 and 5 to compose the backing track for the school song. The children enjoyed and learned a lot from using composition software and experimenting with layering different sounds and rhythms.

Community Albums then went away and used a selection of the children's ideas to create a backing track. They came back on Thursday 16th November and worked with Year 5 and 6 to create the lyrics for our school song. During these sessions the children showed a real understanding of what it meant to be a member of Queensway School and worked closely with our values statement of 'Rise to the challenge, to be the best I can be'.

Community Albums then returned on Thursday 23rd November and carried out recording sessions with individuals, groups of children and the whole school to record our school song. The children enjoyed and learned a lot from the project. We are looking forward to sharing the finished song with everyone when we return in January.
