Dear Parents,

Happy New Year!

I hope that you had an enjoyable and relaxing Christmas break and wish you all the best for 2024.

Topics

Our topics for Term 3 and 4 are: 'On our doorstep' and 'There's no place like home'. In Term 3 the children will be exploring the local area and looking into the physical and human features around Banbury with a Geography focus, exploring maps. In Term 4 we will be exploring Banbury in the past and comparing it to now with a History focus. We will be using our knowledge of our local area to design our own playground in Term 4 also.

Year One Spring curriculum

English

We will be covering a range of genres and writing styles over these two terms. In both Term 3 and 4 children will be continuing to develop their knowledge of different word classes used in all writing e.g. nouns, verbs, and adjectives. In Term 3 children will be continuing to learn stories through text maps including Handa's Surprise. We will also be exploring the poetry genre further through the poem 'The Sound Collector' where children will think of their own sounds they can collect, using verbs and adjectives to describe these. They will continue to consolidate their use of full stops, capital letters and finger spaces in their writing as well as continuing to develop their knowledge of sentences. Lastly, the children will explore instructions further using the book 'Where's my hat' as inspiration and allowing children to create their own innovation of these instructions using features such as imperative verbs (sit, stir, walk etc) and adverbs of time (first, next, then). In Term 4 children will explore the narrative 'Black Rock' learning the text map and continuing to look at features of story writing using adjectives in their writing and consolidating their knowledge of sentence structures. They will continue to explore different types of poetry and can practise their recount writing skills from Terms 1 and 2.

Mathematics

During the Spring term in Maths children will be exploring addition and subtraction, place value, time, multiplication, and fractions. The children will be building on previous knowledge of addition and subtraction using concrete objects and pictorial representations e.g. using number lines, tens frames and counters. We will continue to look at a range of different numbers focusing in this term on numbers to 50, looking at number recognition, representing different numbers and continuing to build on our counting skills. We will be starting to look at counting in 2s, 5s and 10s during our counting sessions as well as consolidating our counting backwards and from any given number. When looking at time, children will be learning to tell the time to an hour and half past and drawing these times on a clock with the different hands. The children will start to look at multiplication using concrete objects and exploring arrays. Lastly, children will start to look at finding haves and quarters of objects, shapes and quantities.

Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHCE)

In Term 3 children will be learning about the importance of valuing differences. Children will be looking at similarities and differences between each other, learning about how to respect our differences and how to celebrate what makes us unique. We will also be exploring what makes different people special to us. In Term 4 the children will be learning about how to keep themselves safe. The children will be learning about the importance of sleep. They will learn about medicine and their uses, as well as how to be safe around medicine. They will also learn about who trusted adults are and who to speak to if they are feeling uncomfortable or unsafe.

To find out what we are learning in all the other subject areas please look at the **'Knowledge Organisers'** which can be found on the school website.

<u>Homework</u>

We really appreciate your help with homework as the work set consolidates the learning that has happened during the week in school. Homework is given in a homework folder on Fridays and is due back into school the following **Thursday** to be checked.

- **English**-Children will receive Spelling or phonics homework alternating each week. Spellings will incorporate practising for a test. Phonics will incorporate an aspect from their weekly phonics lessons.
- Maths Children are set one piece of maths homework to consolidate the work we have been doing in class that week.
- **Reading-** All children are expected to read for at least 5 minutes each day with an adult.

Ways you can help your child at home

We hope your child will enjoy reading with you at home. We can't emphasise enough the importance of reading with your child. They will choose one book from our class library for you both to share, and we will also be sending home reading scheme books. These books will be changed once a week, so it is important that your child brings his/her book bag every day. If your child would like to change their reading book during the week (on a day other than their normal reading day), they can put their book bag into the large box labelled 'Book Bags' in class and a member of staff will then change their book. Please comment or sign the home/school reading diary every time you hear your child read. If your child reads five times a week, they also get a sticker to go on their reading reward chart. 5 stickers would mean that they have read 25 times and will then get a certificate presented to them in our Celebration Assembly.

Certificates are awarded as follows:

- > 25= Bronze
- ➢ 50= Silver
- ≻ 75= Gold
- > 100= Platinum
- > 125= Commended
- ➤ 150= Reading Worm
- 175 = Reading Star

The children's reading record will be checked in school on a Friday to count their reads for the week; therefore, it is important that parents record ALL reading that is done at home.

Term 3 and 4 shared lessons

Each term we will be having a shared lesson, where parents and carers are invited to come into school and take part in a lesson with their child. In term 3, this lesson will focus on DT and developing our skills of weaving and in term 4 our shared lesson will be to do with our outdoor learning experienced at Forest School.

PE days

PE will be indoors on a **Monday** and outdoors on a **Wednesday**. Your child must not wear any jewellery on these days. Please can you make sure that they have appropriate clothing for PE in school all times. As it will be getting colder; warm outside kit is particularly important as we will go out each week unless we have extreme weather.

Indoor kit: Navy shorts and plain white T-shirt. Indoor lessons are done in bare feet or plimsolls.

Outdoor kit: Plain navy shorts or tracksuit bottoms and plain white T-shirt plus plimsolls/trainers. You can also provide a navy fleece or tracksuit top for cold weather.

Please ensure that all clothing brought into school is clearly named.

Forest school

We will be taking part in Forest School in **Term 4.** A letter will be sent out nearer the time as a reminder.

<u>Snack</u>

In Year 1 the children can bring their own morning snack to school with them. This must be a healthy snack of vegetables or fresh or dried fruit. They will still receive a free piece of fruit every day in the afternoon.
