



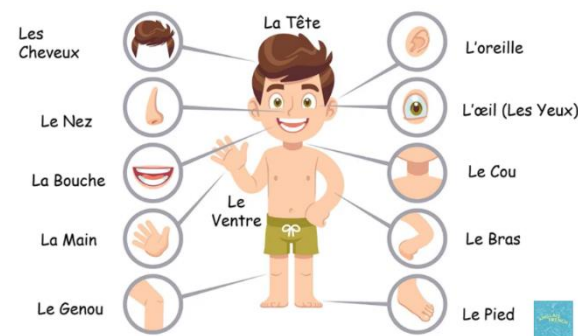
**French facts:**

**KEY GRAMMAR FACTS**

- All nouns in French have a gender - they are either masculine or feminine. We can tell which gender a noun is by the article that goes before it :

ARTICLE	MASCULINE	FEMININE
a	<i>Un</i>	<i>une</i>
the	<i>le / les</i>	<i>la / les</i>

- Most adjectives go after the noun and not before it as they do in English e.g. *un crayon bleu*
- Most consonants are silent at the end of a word (*d,g,m,n,p,s,t,x,z*). Silent letters are highlighted in red.
