

ART – Stone Age

This term in art we will be focusing on cave drawings, based around our Stone Age topic.

We will be focusing on different designs, developing our own ideas before then creating our final design.

We will also use the book 'The first drawing' as inspiration to start our topic off.



Key vocabulary

<u>Cave drawings</u> - In the stone age, hunter gatherers using natural resources to create drawings on caves. These natural resources included charcoal from burnt wood and rock dust.

Natural colours - As the stone age only had natural resources to make drawings, they used mainly brown, black and orange.

<u>Sketching</u> - This is where you press lightly with your pencil to create the outline of your work.

Texture - This means the feeling or appearance of something.

We will be using sketching pencils, oil pastels, and scrunched up paper. Using the image to the right, why do you think we scrunch up the paper?
