Head Teacher's News in Brief

- We said farewell to one of our Teaching Assistants in Year 3, Sam Hughes, at the end of September. She has made a significant contribution to Queensway over 11 years, but we wish her well as she goes back into the caring profession.
- We welcome Miss Emma Sharpe to our team of Teaching Assistants who will be working in Year 1 and After School Club.
- School photos are taking place on Tuesday 15th November 2022. This happens within the school day, and we organise for school age siblings to have a photo together as well as individual shots of every child. They are great for Christmas presents!
- The annual flu vaccinations are happening on Wednesday 16th November 2022. This is for all children in Reception through to Year
 6. Please refer to the Immunisation letter emailed 18/10/22 for more information.
- At the start of term, I wrote to you outlining our aim for this year, which was to put the heart back into Queensway following the Covid period. I am delighted to report the following:
- ➤ 16 clubs have been running this term with 145 children attending at least one club. The children have thoroughly enjoyed them. Thank you to everyone who persevered with the online booking system. The club timetable will change in January so we will write to you in December with more information.
- 236 parents have attended a shared lesson this term which is fantastic.
 We have taken on board parental feedback and will ensure that there is

- only ever one classes' shared lesson on a given day.
- Class assemblies have also started back up and we have been incredibly proud of the children's efforts. There were certainly some nerves as it has been so long since we have done class assemblies but having the moral support of family and friends made a big difference.
- ➤ The bookings for the Year 6 residential are going well, with 23 children already signed up. Please remember to come and speak with us if you require financial support. Closing date for the first instalment is 1st November.
- ➤ We also have 23 children signed up for Bikeability which is for Year 6 next May. It is not too late to return your reply slips!
- 26 children are having music tuition through Music for Schools which is a significant increase from previous years.
- Pupil leadership roles within the school are now established: The School Council, The Sports Council and Well Being Warriors. The children have already shown great leadership skills within these roles. Playground Leaders training is happening straight after half term.
- > Trips for the year ahead are now all bookedplease refer to class letters for details.
- Year 4 have started their weekly integration with a class from Frank Wise school. The children work collaboratively on Character Education tasks- enormous fun is had by all.
- Overall, we have made great strides in implementing our wider curriculum offer and are excited to see this develop further over the course of the year.

Year 1

Year 3

This term, we have been busy learning all about the Stone Age. We have become Hunter Gatherers as well as becoming archaeologists, learning all about the past.

Sunshine Centre have a Citizens Advice dropin Mondays & Wednesdays 10-12 for free confidential advice.

Reminder to parents that the school doors open at 8.30am and close prompt at 8.40am (8.45am for Reception classes). This is a legal requirement to safeguard and register every child in school. Being late to school can embarrass your child and disrupt their class.

Arriving 5 minutes late for school every day = 3.4 days of a school year missed.

Children can still attend school if they have a cough/cold and/or are on antibiotics, but if they have a temperature they should stay at home. Medication must be brought to the office and a consent form signed giving details of medication, dose, and time to be given. If your child were to become too unwell to remain in school, you would be contacted immediately.
