Jews	These are people who follow the religion of Judaism.
Synagogue	This is where Jews go to worship.
Ark	This is a cupboard where the Torah scrolls are
	kept.
Bimah	A raised platform where most of the service
	takes place from. The Torah is read from here.
Eternal	There is a light above the ark. Its name comes
light	from a verse in the Torah which says an eternal
	flame should burn in the temple all the time.





Christianity







Key vocabulary:

Jesus	In Christianity, Jesus is believed to be the son of God.
Christians	These are people who follow the religion of Christianity.
Bible	The bible is the holy book for Christianity. It is split into two sections: the Old Testament and the New Testament.
Harvest	The gathering of crops.
Crops	A large group of plants, like fruit and vegetables.
Harvest	A Christian celebration of the food grown on the
festival	land. Christians thank God for the land and food.
Autumn	This is the season that harvest takes place in.
Annual	It happens every year.
