



Who were the Romans?

The Romans lived in Rome, a city in the centre of the country of Italy. Rome started to grow from a small town into a large city in 753 B.C. They ruled over nearly all of Europe and most of north Africa, including Egypt. It is thought that one of the reasons the Romans invaded Britain was to conquer land, gain more slaves and collect the many precious resources in Britain including metals such as lead, tin, gold and silver.

Important people

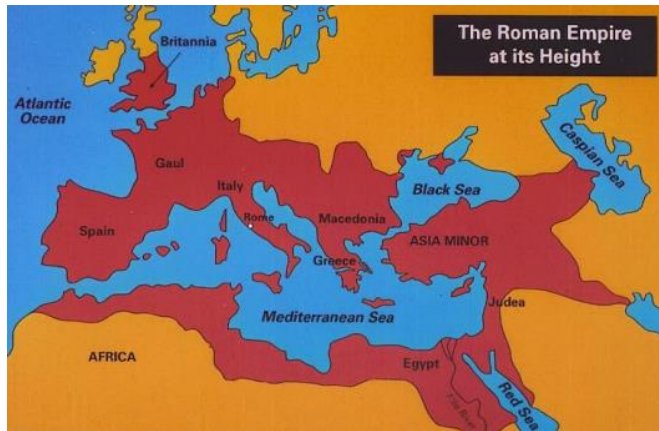
Caesar - In 55BC Caesar, with 80 ships and 80,000 men, tried to invade England but he didn't succeed. The next year he came back with 800 and again he didn't manage to conquer South-England.

Claudius (AD 10–54) Claudius was the emperor who conquered Britain.

Boudicca: A woman who led her army against the Romans.
